This handout will provide you with information about fertility clinics, estimated preservation costs, and funding options for preserving your fertility.

**Fertility is the ability to have biological children.**

Your experiences and preferences regarding your sexual and reproductive health are important.

Your medical team will speak with you about your diagnosis, treatment, and any risks to fertility. They can also refer you to a fertility specialist to talk about your options.

## Estimated Fertility Preservation Costs

**Note:** these costs are estimated based on information from all Atlantic Provinces as of February 2026. The exact cost at the fertility clinic you choose may vary. **You will likely pay more than one fee throughout your fertility treatment.** For example, one round of IVF may cost between \$10,000 and \$17,000 dollars.

Description of Fee	Patient Fee
Annual storage fees	<b>\$475 - 520</b>
Sperm freezing and 1st year of storage	<b>\$430 - 835</b>
Egg retrieval and freezing (procedure not available in NB)	<b>\$6,105</b>
Ovarian tissue cryopreservation (procedure not available in NB)	<b>\$4,150</b>
Surgical sperm aspiration (PESA/TESA/Micro-Tese) and 1st year of storage	<b>\$3,760 - 8,228</b>
Testicular tissue cryopreservation (procedure not available in NB)	<b>\$2,200</b>
In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) Cycle	<b>\$6,600 - 9,580</b>
Sperm analysis	<b>\$350 - 530</b>

If you or your direct family members have private health insurance, inquire about possible fertility coverage included in your plan.

Speak with the social worker or patient care coordinator at your cancer centre for information about any additional funding that may be available.

## Provincial Funding: Fertility Treatment Reimbursement Program


### What is the New Brunswick Fertility Treatment Reimbursement Program?

New Brunswick (GNB) offers a fertility treatment reimbursement program for in-vitro fertilization (IVF) and/or intrauterine insemination (IUI).

The grant covers 100% of the cost, up to a maximum of \$20,000 for IVF and/or \$10,000 for IUI (per household). To be eligible, you must be a New Brunswick resident with a valid Medicare card, have a valid infertility diagnosis, and complete the treatment at a recognized clinic. GNB will reimburse NB residents even if the service is offered in NB and they choose to go to NS for the service. NS is the only province GNB will accept.

## National Funding: Fertile Future - Power of Hope

### What is the Fertile Future: Power of Hope Program?

Fertile Future is a Canadian national non-profit organization that provides fertility preservation information and support services to cancer patients and oncology professionals.

- Due to time constraints and unexpected costs, many cancer patients are unable to access fertility preservation procedures prior to undergoing treatment.
- The Power of Hope Cost Reduction Program has been designed to help change this reality for those who wish to pursue sperm banking and egg or embryo preservation.
- Fertile Future has partnered with fertility treatment facilities across Canada to increase access to fertility preservation services for cancer patients.





## National Funding: Fertile Future - Power of Hope

### Who is eligible?

To be eligible for cost reduction, each of the following program criteria must be met:

- Fertility Centre administering fertility preservation treatment must be a member of the Power of Hope program.
- Household income of \$50,000 or less.
- Confirmation from applicant's oncologist indicating that cancer treatment presents a risk to fertility and that they support fertility preservation as safe and appropriate for applicant.
- Applicant must be 40 years of age or younger.
- Applicant must be a Canadian Citizen or have Permanent Resident status.
- Applicant must have a valid provincial health card.
- Applicant has not previously benefited from the Power of Hope program.
- No more than one year has elapsed since fertility preservation was performed.

## National Funding: Fertile Future - Power of Hope

continued

### How much funding can be accessed?

#### Sperm Preservation:

- \$350 for one sperm collection (including analysis, freezing, and 1 year of storage of sample).

#### Egg or Embryo Preservation:

- Pharmaceutical product
- Maximum charge of \$4000 for egg retrieval and egg or embryo cryopreservation
- Fertile Future will reimburse up to \$1000 to help assist in accessing these vital services.
