Body Image Survey from Saskatchewan

Dear Potential Participant,

We are inviting all health care professionals (HCPs) who care for adolescent/young adult (AYA) oncology patients to participate in a survey about **provider perceptions of body image concerns encountered by their patients**.

Dr. Devon Christoffel and Dr. Paul D'Alessandro are conducting this study (USask REB #BEH-5499) in order to examine whether there are discrepancies between patient and provider perceptions of body image changes throughout the course of a patient's cancer experience.

This 5-10 minute survey will ask you to report on the most prevalent body image concerns that you see in your AYA oncology/transplant patients, and the practices and interventions you utilize (or see others utilize) as part of your practice.

Eligibility Criteria

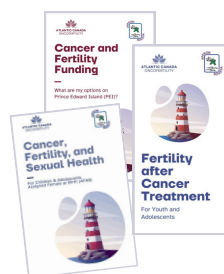
We are inviting all professionals who care for AYA oncology patients to provide their input, including:

- Pediatric Oncologists/Hematologists
 - Pediatric Physicians (including Pediatricians, Hospitalists, Clinical Associates, and Family Physicians who primarily serve pediatric patients)
 - Medical Oncologists and Hematologists
 - Adult Physicians (non-Hematology/Oncology including IM Physicians, Hospitalists, Clinical Associates, and Family Physicians)
 - Radiation Oncologists
 - Surgeons (Pediatric Surgeons, Surgical Oncologists, etc.)
 - Resident Physicians and Fellows (regardless of discipline)
 - Psychiatrists and Clinical Psychologists
 - Nurses, Nurse Practitioners and Advanced Practice RNs
 - Oncology Allied Health staff (ie. Social Workers, Pharmacists, OT/PT, Dieticians)
 - Any other health professionals involved in the treatment of AYA oncology patients
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Navigating Fertility Preservation for Cancer Patients: New Guidelines & Educational Resources

As most of our APPHON/ROHPPA community is aware, APPHON/ROHPPA has taken the lead for a Canadian Partnership Against Cancer project in Atlantic Canada. A lot of work has been completed with the help of various provincial working groups, a steering committee, and a fabulous patients and family working group as well as patient and family representation on all working groups. The updated guidelines for both pediatrics and adults are now available on our website: [Oncofertility Guidelines](#). Thank you to all who have provided feedback.

Educational resources have also been developed as part of the Atlantic Canada Oncofertility project. Providers are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the various resources available to patients. Providing clinicians and patients with information on the localized resources is also a key component of these new guidelines and educational resources.

The guidelines provide clear options for fertility clinics available for the residents of each province, along with contact information, to facilitate seamless referrals. Clinicians are urged to discuss fertility preservation with all patients/family members (as appropriate) regardless of the treatment risk. Our educational materials were developed to respond to the questions from our patients/family members and funding brochures have been developed for all provinces. All materials will be linked through each province's health resources to the APPHON/ROHPPA website. We will maintain the documents.
