Guideline Update 2023

The Guidelines for the Management of Febrile Neutropenia in Children will be reviewed based on the recently released update (Lehrnbecher T et al., 2023). The Guidelines for Varicella Zoster/Herpes Zoster in Immunocompromised Children will be updated if new information is available.

Due to an expression of need, the following Care Pathways will be created for the management of Sickle Cell Disease (Acute Chest Syndrome, Acute Painful Episodes, Vaso-Occlusive Crisis, Acute Splenic Sequestration, Peri-Operative Management, Priapism, Hydroxyurea Guidelines, and Stroke).

Lastly, the APPHON/ROHPPA Guideline Committee will review the WHO Guidelines on the Management of Chronic Pain in Children, for adoption or adaption.

From the IWK Children's Oncology Group (COG) Team

First, we would like to acknowledge the amazing ongoing commitment of the regional pediatric teams throughout the Maritime provinces. Because of all of you, and your willingness to share the care of children and adolescents with cancer on clinical trial, we can offer children and adolescents cutting-edge therapies, while still enabling them to safely go home, when able. If we did not have this partnership, patients could not go home if they chose clinical trial. Families would be separated for longer periods of time, causing additional hardship. Some families would not choose to participate in a trial if this barrier existed, which could impact their outcomes. Part of this commitment has

required pediatricians across the provinces to complete and maintain research training to ensure we are meeting research regulations. We have been asking you to do this training for seven years now, and many of you have renewed several times; we are well established in this program. Because of each of you, the Maritime provinces are now recognized as a 'state of the art' program for regional access to clinical trials, which many other provinces aspire to! And because of you and this incredible partnership, patients families can have additional hope wherever possible...invaluable!

Secondly, the COG team would like to update you on our current COG staff. On January 31, 2023, we had the privilege of watching a legend retire from the office. Tina Bocking has worked in Hematology/Oncology for 35 years and was a COG Clinical Research Associate for 25 of those years; working with every COG Principal Investigator we have had so far.
